President's report

It has been a turbulent 12 months for the ACT Master Plumbers Association during which time we have had a change in leadership both at a board level and the executive officer. During this time, the MPA went on as Business as usual and the important role we play in helping the community and our members continued despite the changes.

In the second half of last year, we renegotiated the Master Plumbers / Icon Water agreed on reimbursement rates and saw a 60% increase across the board to be implemented over a three year period, backdated to July 2018 with the agreed rates to be fully implemented by 2020. These rates were carefully calculated with the Icon Water head of finance and MPA representatives and took into consideration the running costs of a "standard" maintenance business including safety measures that need to be considered when excavating to depths above 1.5m. In addition to this, we have held business education nights with business expert guest trainers where members have been able to learn how to calculate an hourly rate based on facts and figures from their business.

Leigh Watson took on the role of Executive Officer in February 2019. Leigh has great energy and a positive can-do attitude.

The board's focus has been on investigating and addressing what we believe are major concerns in the ACT. One of our primary focuses has been on backflow prevention in the ACT. Currently, there is a major concern shared by Icon Water, MPA ACT and acknowledged by Access Canberra, in that there is a huge number of registered valves that are not being maintained and tested as required in by the Australian Standards. This is a major concern for the community due to the hazard a failing valve can create to the potable water supply. It is our goal to work with both Icon Water and Access Canberra to ensure these issues are resolved in a timely fashion.

I also want our members to feel they are supported to carry out their work professionally and to have strong and flourishing businesses.
